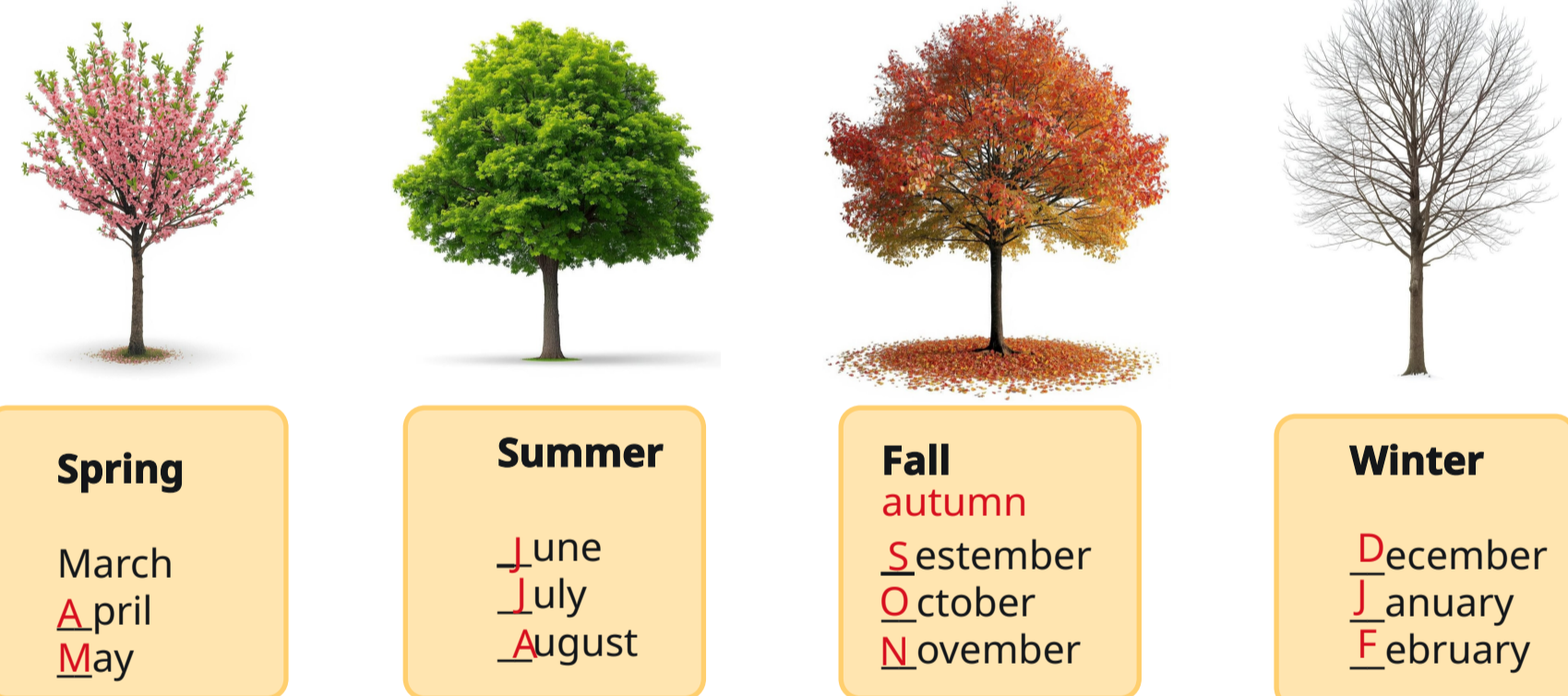

THE RHYTHM OF THE AMERICAN YEAR

For many people in the U.S., the year doesn't just start on **January 1st** it revolves around the academic and seasonal shifts. In Chicago, where I live, the transition from **Summer** to **Fall** is **marked** by "Back to School" season. **Although** summer officially ends in late **September**, students usually **head back** to the classroom **in August**. By the time **October 31st** arrives, the city is covered in autumn leaves. Halloween is a massive event, but many professionals are already **looking forward** to Thanksgiving, which is celebrated **on the fourth Thursday of November**. It's a time for gratitude and heavy meals before the chaos of "Black Friday."
Winter can be brutal here, especially **in January**. However, the holiday season provides a nice distraction. We celebrate Christmas **on December 25th** and it's a tradition in my house to start opening gifts **at exactly 7:00 a.m.** When **Spring** finally **blooms**, **in April** the energy changes. We celebrate Earth Day **on April 22nd**, focusing on **sustainability**. My own birthday falls **on May 15th**, right as the weather warms up. It's a perfect time to reflect on the first half of the year before the cycle starts all over again.
